Overseas schools participating in the 6th Japan Experience Program for Overseas Children announced

Hakuho Foundation (Chairman, Junji Narita), a public interest incorporated foundation, announced today at a Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports and Science press conference the overseas schools that will participate in its 6th Japan Experience Program for Overseas Children.

Following rigorous screening by a judging panel comprised of experts, 14 schools from 13 countries and territories were selected to participate in the Program. (See annex)

• Program objective

To provide opportunities for Japanese and overseas students to deepen their understanding of each other and grow into internationally-minded people through intercultural experiences and international exchanges in the Japanese language.

Program overview

The Program invites children studying Japanese at middle school-level learning institutions overseas to Japan to visit a Japanese school and take part in exchange activities and cultural and social experiences with students of the same age to promote deeper understanding of and interest in the language and culture of Japan.

Support provided

Return airfares to Japan, accommodation, meals and activities (including training and travel and expenses)

Schedule

April 18–29, 2015 (tentative)

Preparatory training for the Japanese language teachers that will accompany students from the participating overseas schools will be held from November 18–December 4, 2014.
