Call for applications from Japanese junior high schools for the 14th Japanese Language Exchange Program

Hakuhodo Foundation, a public interest incorporated foundation, announced today that it had begun accepting applications from Japanese junior high schools interested in taking part in its 14th Japanese Language Exchange Program.

■ Objectives

The Japanese Language Exchange Program aims at providing opportunities for students to grow into “individuals who can work together with people to address social issues on a global scale”. By socializing with junior high school students from approximately 10 countries around the world, we provide participants with opportunities to experience intercultural coexistence and encourage students to make continuous efforts to improve their life skills.

■ Program overview

The Japanese Language Exchange Program invites students studying Japanese language at middle school level in order to interact with Japanese junior high school students. During the core of this program implemented in May 2024, students and teachers from approximately 10 countries will come to Japan and participate in camp-style extracurricular activities, visit Japanese schools, and experience homestays. Making the program more meaningful, frequent opportunities such as online activities combining with face-to-face event will be offered.

■ Number of schools accepted

Program development cooperation school [1-year course]: 1-2 schools

Program development promotion school [3-year course]: 1 school

■ Eligibility

- The school must provide lower secondary education as stipulated in School Education Act of Japan
- The school must obtain permission to participate in the program from the national government or related government agencies as necessary
- The school must accept a visit (including homestay) of overseas schools participating in this program
- One teacher must accompany with the students as a leader for the program
- The school must engage actively in this program both for the preparation and the implementation

- * Schools that have participated in this Program previously are eligible to apply again.

■ Expenses Covered

- Expenses related to this program (including accommodation, meals, transportation expenses, and insurance premiums, etc.)
- Expenses related to hosting an overseas school (during school visit in Japan)
- Expenses related to promoting online exchanges with overseas schools (examples of usage: equipment purchases, ICT support outsourcing, ICT training for the teachers, etc.)
[1-year course: maximum of 1 million yen / 3-year course: initial year maximum of 1 million yen, maximum of 500,000 yen/ year from year two, total of 2 million yen over 3 years]

- Notification of results: Early October 2023 (tentative)
